Our collaborative, led by Lift Up Sarpy County, brings together religious organizations, government, business and private donors to help. Over the past year, this network provided financial assistance, financial education and other supports to help families begin their journey to sustainability. But it hasn't been easy.

In 2022 alone, Lift Up Sarpy County, in collaboration with our partners, provided the following in terms of financial assistance:

Housing	\$ 743,108
Transportation	\$ 114,344
Medical/Mental Health	\$ 7,459
Food Insecurity	\$ 10,903
Utilities	\$ 141,900
Education/Childcare	\$ 18,028
